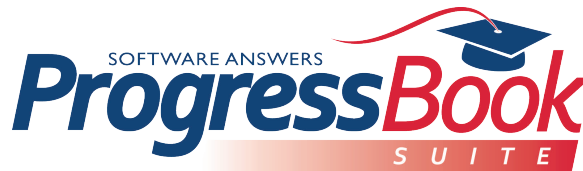
The ProgressBook Suite is being developed to meet the Instructional Improvement System (IIS) standards defined in Race to the Top.
